A MESSAGE FROM OUR TREASURER, CHRIS COLLIER

St. Timothy's offerings continue to be lower than our budgeted level despite having realized nearly \$98,000 of income from our cash and investments, which is included in our Actual Offerings & Other Income. It is our practice to not budget income from investments. So, while we anticipate a greater level of offerings during the final months of the year as we enter the holiday season, it is important that we recognize that your continued generosity is important to fund our operations and ministries.

Throughout this year we have prudently managed our costs and continue to operate with sound oversight of our spending. We have been able to offset increases in campus related maintenance activities and higher than planned utilities costs through spending at lower rates in other areas and operating with reduced levels of staffing.

STEWARDSHIP PACKETS



Your Stewardship Commitments may be returned by one of these methods: U.S. Mail, in-person at worship on November 10 or with the online form.




WAYS TO GIVE

for South Valley FISH Food Pantry




We recommend 8-12 lbs maximum weight for the turkeys.


