

Pastor's Pen

As we have finished this sermon series on our vision for ministry, focusing on *hospitality, discipleship, and mission*, the new season of Grow Groups has begun, and I am reflecting on the time spent at the Men's Retreat at the end of September, one thing is sticking out in my mind as a personal theme to focus on in this coming season: discipleship.

Discipleship can be one of those slippery ideassometimes it seems like it has so many different meanings that it doesn't mean much of anything. Sometimes the way we talk about discipleship is so abstract that it's hard to see how it actually connects with my life right now. In our previous sermon series, I shared these thoughts on the questions, "What is a disciple?" and "What is Discipleship?"

"A disciple is, simply put, someone who *follows Jesus*. And discipleship is following Jesus *together*."

I want to share a meditation that has been fruitful for me personally as I think how discipleship happens in my life. The Apostle Paul gives a brilliant and simple explanation of discipleship in 1 Corinthians 11:1. To the Church in Corinth he says, "Imitate me as I imitate Christ." If you can say this simple sentence to someone else honestly then you can do discipleship. So often I hear folks who think, "I can't do it because...

- -... I don't know the Bible well enough."
- -... I need to get my life figured out first."
- -... I'm not a leader."

But the truth is you don't *need* any of those things. In saying, "Imitate me as I imitate Christ," you are not saying I am so knowledgeable, charismatic and moral that you will be closer to God if you try and be like me.

Instead, what you are saying is, "I am trying to follow Christ. I'm not perfect at it, but I'm going to invite you to join me in doing it. When you see that my life is in line with God's word, when you see that I am reflecting Christ in the way I live, imitate that. And when I don't, point me to God's word."

When we do this with and for one another, that is discipleship. So as a pastor, I can say to you, "imitate me as I imitate Christ." But as my sister or brother in Christ, you can say the same to me, and to one another. An as we commit to this journey of learning from the Bible, Jesus, and one another how to be more Christ-like, God works powerfully in and through us.

Our offerings and other income are modestly above our budgeted levels, however this

favorable performance is primarily due to having realized \$81,000 of income from our investments which was not budgeted. 


