Pastor's Pen

In the Gospel of Matthew, John the Baptist and Jesus both say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near!"

"The kingdom of heaven has come near!" Jesus says this in chapter 4, but it actually flows naturally from the beginning of Matthew which starts with these words, "This is the family tree of Jesus, the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham..."

Messiah (Hebrew) and *Christ* (Greek) both mean "Anointed One." It's clear from the story of King David that we're learning about the King sent from God to bring the Kingdom.

The birth of Jesus, which we celebrate at Christmas, is the birth of the long-awaited Messiah. The nativity story in the Gospel of Matthew tells us about the Wise Men from the East (Epiphany). They honor the baby Jesus with gifts that show their recognition that he is a King.

At St. Tim's, we'll be going through The Story together in 2025. This is the story of our Creator and Redeemer. As we read about God's interactions with the world and his people, we realize that His Story is Our Story, and it's actually THE STORY (of the creation and redemption of the world).

We believe Jesus is King. We trust in Jesus as our Savior. We trust in Jesus as our Lord (one who has authority, control, and power; acting as ruler). This belief is what brings definition to the Kingdom of God. This is one of the important concepts that Jesus shared in the New Testament.

We're honored to serve the King, and it's incredible to know that we're his ambassadors, spreading the good news of Jesus to the world and living as citizens of His Kingdom.

Even though this might not sound like our usual language, it's actually quite biblical. As we follow The Story, we'll be looking for the signs of Christ's rule and our call to live as ambassadors of the King.

I am convinced that this focus will deepen our faith this year, and bring a stronger sense of God working His purposes through our lives. It's going to be an amazing year!

FROM OUR TREASURER, CHRIS COLLIER St. Timothy's continues to be supported by generous giving by our congregation, however, we are modestly lower than our budgeted level as we have realized roughly \$134,000 of income from our investments that is not budgeted, which is included in our Offerings & Other Income. We anticipate a greater level of offerings during the month of December, similar to prior years. Your continued generosity is important to fund our operations and ministries.

We continue to operate prudently and with sound oversight of our spending. Administration has done a good job of operating with a much lower level of cost and investment.
